• Developing Programming for an Interdisciplinary Arts Building (IAB) with the departments of Art and Music, Theatre, and Dance (MTD). Project will pursue \$100 million in grant and foundation philanthropy to serve as a gateway to campus.

• Re-located and consolidated 50,000 s.f. of campus space to save nearly \$250,000 each year

- Prioritize and coordinate over \$200,000 in state renovation and repair funding for the College of Arts and Sciences.
